

## Water Fronts for June 30

Angry Hillbillies won for the second straight week, taking first place in the spinnaker class in the Frenchy's Rum Run Race on Saturday. The race was hosted by Ventura Sailing Club.

Other winners were Velero in the non-spinnaker class, Afterburner in the Multi-hull class and Sailbad the Sinner in the Beachcat class.

Angry Hillbillies, an Olson 30 skippered by Paul Moore corrected out by more than six minutes over Alan McNaughton's Hobbie 33, Wahoo. A week ago Angry Hillbillies won Anacapa Yacht Club's Platform A Race.

Afterburner sailed the 30 mile course from Mandalay buoy around a buoy at Frenchy's Cove on Anacapa Island, then back around the Mandalay buoy and the whistle bouy and finishing in Ventura Harbor in a lightning fast 2 hours, 3 minutes, 29 seconds. The fastest monohull was Wahoo, which sailed the course in 4 hours, 13 minutes, 20 seconds.

Brent Swanson easily won the non-spinnaker class in his Islander 29, Velero, by almost 7 minutes over Chuck Manley's Del Rey 24, Spit Dog.

In the Beachcat class, Jim mcWaters prevailed in his Hobie 16, Banana Split. The race started in the normal June gloom, but with 8 to 10 knots of wind and building to the 12 to 14 knot range at the island.

Eighteen boats competed.

Trophies will be presented at VSC's regular monthly meeting at the VSC "clubhouse," The Victoria Pub and Grill in Ventura at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 12.

VSC's race committee offered a special thanks to Anacapa Yacht Club for hosting the skippers meeting and after-race festivities.

The second session of Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundations' Summer Sailing Program kicks off on July 5 and runs through July 15. There are additional sessions on July 18-29 and Aug. 1-12.

Classes for youths 8 through 18 range from beginner to advanced. Session 2 of Ventura Yacht Club's summer youth sailing program starts on July 5 and runs through July 15. The program is open to all sailors, ages eight to 16. Four two-week (½ day) sessions are offered: The first session ends Friday. After the July 5-15 session, there are sessions on July 18-29 and Aug. 1-12.

Beginner sailors will have their sessions in the mornings from 8 a.m. to noon and the intermediate/advanced sailors meet from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

The summer classes have an average instructor-to-student ratio of 6:1, so the students receive the highest degree of attention and tailoring to their specific needs. Boats are provided for the students. The head instructors are US Sailing Certified Instructors, and are able to certify students through US Sailing.

All students are required to pass a swim test on the first day of class. The cost is \$300 for each two week session.
